**FIRST QUARTER HIGHLIGHTS 2023**

**NON-STUDENT TEACHERS AT SIEM REAP DORMITORY**

As mentioned in earlier reports, JGG activities in Cambodia are now focused on operating its dormitories in Phnom Penh and Siem Reap. The final group of eight JGG Student Teachers that graduated from high school last December have all moved on to higher education.

Meanwhile, JGG has been working to identify needy students who were not Student

Teachers that wish to stay in JGG dormitories as space becomes available.

With 18 students already in the two Phnom Penh dormitory buildings the focus has been on finding students to stay at JGG's Siem Reap dormitory.

During the first quarter three students studying nursing at Angkor University, who are not former Student Teachers, were accepted by JGG. So, now there are a total of four nursing

students staying at the Siem Reap dormitory. JGG will continue to seek deserving students to join us in Siem Reap.

## **THE LAST GROUP OF STUDENT TEACHERS MOVE ON TO HIGHER EDUCATION**

Of the eight former Student Teachers that recently graduated high school, five have moved into JGG's Phnom Penh dormitories. The university majors they chose were Information Technology, Mathematics, Management and Nursing. Of the remaining three graduates, two chose to study in Pursat and one in Battambang at the government nursing college.

The new university students in Phnom Penh are in the process of finding full-time jobs so

## UPDATE ON COVID-19 IN CAMBODIA

The Ministry of Health reports that while COVID cases continue to decline, unreported cases are not included in these figures. So, there is some uncertainty in the exact figures. However, overall COVID seems to be under control. Since the onset of the pandemic in early 2020, **as of March 31<sup>st</sup>, 2023**, Cambodia has had a total of **138,725 confirmed cases** with **135,666 recoveries** and **3,056 deaths**.

The vaccination process in Cambodia continues to move forward. As of the 31<sup>st</sup> March 2023, a total of 16,201,960 individuals got vaccinated, 14,652,619 received two doses. 10,620,269 received a booster dose, with 6,163,411 receiving a 4<sup>th</sup> booster, and 1,603,025 receiving a 5<sup>th</sup> booster dose, and 340,725 receiving a 6<sup>th</sup> booster dose. Cambodia has a population of just under 17 million.
